The impact of the PPG for 2015/2016 was:

The impact of the PPG goes beyond academic achievement. It has provided memorable and enriching opportunities for pupils, which have contributed significantly (although difficult to measure) to raising self-esteem, confidence, concentration, and independence and to preparing children for the next stages in their education. This includes assisting in residential and school trip costs, and providing additional support to develop and extend social skills and help children manage emotions and behaviour.

Regular assessment and monitoring ensures pupils receive necessary and appropriate interventions, support and resources both within school and at home, and that teaching and learning opportunities and activities meet children's individual needs.

At the end of term 2, in the academic year 2015/2016, teacher assessment shows that for children in receipt of PPG 74% are on track to meet / exceed expected progress in Reading, 84% in Writing and 84% in Maths.

It is also important to note that the impact of the PPG must be evaluated over a number of years as children learn, develop and mature at differing rates. It is also important to note that some children in receipt of the PPG also have other additional needs that impact on their learning and rates of progress.

The BAGs scheme continues to be very popular and provides additional resources for use at home to support many areas of the curriculum.

The Maths library has also enabled children to borrow quality games and resources to enrich learning to see Maths as a 'fun' subject.

Staff resources (GTA and teacher) have made a significant contribution to children's learning, providing targeted support to children to address gaps in learning or to further stretch those making good progress.

Attending related training events and conferences have increased staff skills and knowledge, and ensured the PPG is used to its greatest effect.
