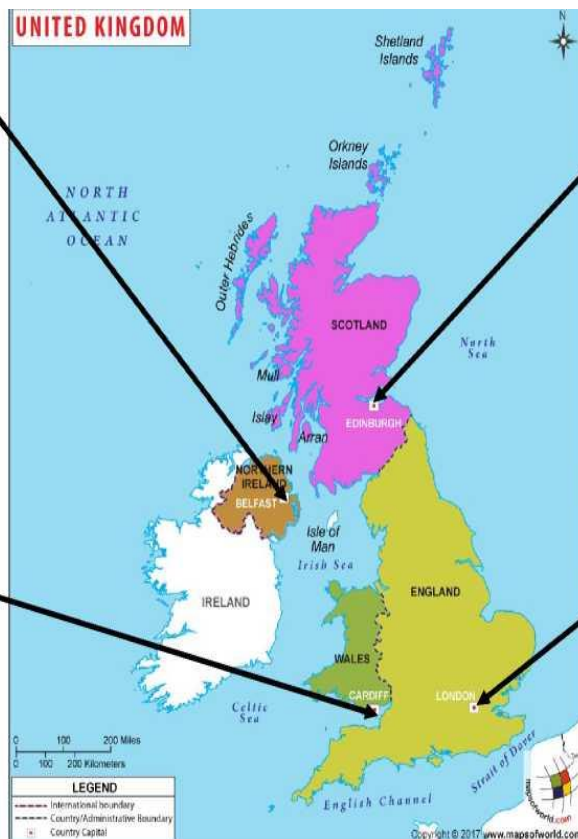

What is it like to live in the United Kingdom?

People

The UK is made from a mixture of cultures. London has the largest non-white population of any European city. Over 250 languages are spoken in the UK. Therefore, British people are multicultural.

Nature

The UK has flat grasslands, beaches, thick forests and rugged mountains. There are lots of farms in the UK. The rugged mountains of the Scottish Highlands are almost untouched by humans.

Weather

In the UK, we have warm summers and cool winters. We get lots of rain which helps to feed our very green and fertile land. It can also get quite windy.

Government

We live in a **democracy**. The Prime Minister and their party, within the houses of Parliament - in Westminster - decide the laws in the UK.
