(see attached)</p> <p>Go onto TTRockstars, or Hit the Button</p> <p>Write a shopping list, then add up the prices / find the change</p> <p>Practise telling the time – can you convert from digital to analogue and vice versa? Work out what time a TV programme will finish if it starts at ____ and is ____ minutes / hours long.</p>
English (reading/writing)	<p>Please try to read every day – anything that you have at home (preferably not on a screen)</p> <p>Reading comprehensions (see attached) – 1 or 2 per week: The Story of Easter, The London Marathon, Fossils, Garden Birds</p> <p>Writing – Make your own Easter Story book (use attached pictures or draw your own) See the RE section below for the animated story.</p> <p>Easter traditions – write about the traditions that your family follows, then research into other traditions from around the world.</p> <p>Sit outside for 5 minutes and list all the things you can hear or see. Then add an adjective to each word eg. a hungry blackbird. Then pick at least 5 words and write a sentence for each which includes the adjective and an adverb eg. The hungry blackbird chirps noisily. Extra challenge, add a conjunction to extend your sentence further eg. The hungry blackbird chirps noisily while its chick waits in the nest for the next feed.</p>
Science	<p>Try out the following investigations:</p> <p>Can people with longer legs run faster?</p> <p>Can people with bigger hands catch a ball better?</p> <p>What type of habitat do worms prefer? Damp or Dry, Dark or Light?</p> <p>Think about how you can make it a fair test, make a prediction first, then test it out. What conclusion can you make?</p>
History	<p>Speak to some of the older people in your family and find out some interesting pieces of family history.</p>
Geography	<p>Explore a map of the world – can you name the continents, sea and oceans?</p> <p>How many capital cities can you name?</p>
PE	<p>Make an obstacle course in your garden – who can complete it the quickest?</p> <p>Make a bat from a tray or chopping board and see how many times you can hit the ball without it falling.</p> <p>Joe Wickes / Go noodle</p>
