<p><u>Weekly Theme: ‘Rainforests’</u></p> <p>This week you will be finding out about Rainforests. Rainforest, also spelled rain forest, luxuriant forest, generally composed of tall, broad-leaved trees and usually found in wet tropical uplands and lowlands around the <u>Equator</u>.</p> <p>Rainforests usually occur in regions where there is a high annual rainfall of generally more than 1,800 mm (70 inches) and a hot and steamy climate. The trees found in these regions are evergreen. Rainforests may also be found in <u>areas of the tropics</u> in which a dry season occurs, such as the “dry rainforests” of North Eastern Australia. In these regions annual rainfall is between 800 and 1,800 mm and as many as 75 percent of the trees are <u>deciduous</u>.</p> <p>Your first task is to find out what the three words that are underlined mean. (2) Where do you find Tropical Rainforests? (3) What kind of animals would you find in a Rainforest? (4) Are all the animals safe or are some dangerous? (5) What layers are there to a Rainforest? (6) Which layer do most plants and animals live/ Why?
Art/DT	<p>Think about the creatures/animals you would find in a Rainforest. Where might it live? What could it eat? Does it have any predators?</p> <p>Your job is to design and then make your own creature/animal that could live in a Tropical Rainforest.</p>
