Football Fair Play Charter

When playing football, we will:

Always remember our 3 school rules and CARE values

Always play to the best of our ability

Respect other players for the benefit of the game

Understand that everyone has different skills and abilities and ensure teams are even

Pass the ball to others when playing

Play fairly-we will not cheat, dive, slide tackle or foul

Play by the rules and respect the decision of adults

Avoid interrupting other football games

Be gracious in winning and losing

Talk to an adult to help resolve any difficulties

If we do not follow this charter, we understand that we may:

Need to apologise to our team mates, the other team or adults

Talk with an adult to resolve any difficulty

Miss part or all of a playtime

Be prevented from playing football for a given period of time
