School Governors

What do governors do?

School governors have three main core functions:

- · Setting the vision and strategic direction of the school
- Holding the headteacher to account for its educational performance, and
- Ensuring financial resources are well spent.

We do this at a strategic level, leaving Mrs Chappell to do the day to day running of the school but we monitor progress through discussions at meetings, reviewing results and by going into school and taking part in some of school life. We have two committees that focus on resources and school improvement in more depth alongside the annual programme of meetings. This year we have re-organised the roles and responsibilities within the governing body. We have an ongoing programme of work to review spending, and review and update policies, as well as monitoring the progress in school. The policies are available on the Hemingbrough school website. A big job this year has been taking part in a school health check and subsequently responding to the Ofsted inspection (more below).

We all really enjoy coming into school to talk to the teaching staff and the pupils, and each governor has a particular subject that they liaise with so that we can get to know a bit more about how it is taught and how progress is being made. New governors are elected either as parent governors, or members of the community are invited on to help particularly if there is a particular skill set that they have. These are called co-opted governors. If you are interested in becoming a governor, please contact Mrs Chappell to discuss it, as we currently have three vacancies we want to fill.

Remembering Ben Rankin

Ben Rankin passed away in the Autumn of 2014. He was a fantastic teacher at the school, who was loved and respected by everyone that knew him. He is really missed. In his memory, the school is going to present an annual award for outstanding achievement in Year 6 and a ceramic wall of flowers in his memory will be created and mounted in the school entrance hall.

Sports Funding.

Good use is made of the primary school sports funding to improve the quality of teaching in physical education (PE), increase the range of sports and competitions available to pupils and to provide a wider range of after-school sports activities. As a result, the number of pupils regularly taking part in extra sporting activities has increased. Some of the opportunities that have been available over the last year have been: Archery, new age kurling, boccia, lacrosse, floor lacrosse, eurohoc, handball and Freddie fit.

At Hemingbrough Primary School, we aim to have a broad curriculum of subjects and experiences for the children. Some of the highlights this year were: Roald Dahl Day, Big Sing, Pantomime, Vive La France Day, Puzzle Day, STEM Fair and Election week.
