Science	<p>Time for a summer walk! What has changed outside now that we are in July? Collect some examples of things that you have spotted. Use them to make a collage, or you can look carefully to draw your finds. Some of your finds might be alive, like a bee or a dragonfly so you will definitely need to draw them! Now label them to say why you chose each item and what it tells you about summer.</p> <p>Can you name any of the plants or trees you have seen? Here are some words you might want to use: petal, flower, leaf, blossom, stem, scent, red, blue, light/dark green, yellow, pink, white.</p>
Art	<p>Linked to Science- Observational drawing</p> <p>Look closely at a flower or a leaf. What shape is it? Does it have straight edges? What can you see on the leaf?</p> <p>Very carefully sketch a picture of your chosen flower or leaf.</p> <p>Remember to post it on FB so I can see it</p>

DT	<p>Make your own paper areophone. How far does it fly? Have a go at measuring the distance if you can. What is the furthest you can fly it? Lets have a little friendly competition- post the distance your paper areophone flies on FB— GOOD LUCK</p>
