School Governors

School governors have three main core functions:

Governors meet at regular intervals through the year to assess School performance, ensure the School is run smoothly and within budget and discuss any external factors that may affect the School – for example the recent discussions nationally regarding Academies and the new National Curriculum.

Governors also take an individual specialism (such as Science, Maths, Child Protection) and liaise with the teacher responsible directly during the year. We visit classes and view teaching, which gives us a great insight into School life and allows us to ensure the decisions may need to make are always done with the best interests of the School and pupils in mind.

Science In School

This year we have had lots of opportunities to develop the teaching and learning of science throughout the school, after applying for an Intensive Enthuse Award to ensure this continues with the move on to the new National Curriculum. Staff attended training sessions provided by The Yorkshire Agricultural Society to look at how we can develop our learning outdoors. We also purchased a Working Scientifically Trolley which holds all the equipment the children need to carry out their own investigations. It helps us to remember that if the Science Trolley is in the classroom, we are learning about science! Our Science Leaders were also able to plant the "rocket seeds" sent to space with British astronaut Tim Peake. To try to further develop the links between home and school, the Science You Can Do At Home after school club was started so that children can show parents and siblings some amazing science experiments that can be done with common kitchen products.



The schools is very lucky to have an amazing outdoor area that can be used to enhance the teaching and learning in science. We have begun to look at zoning off areas to complete different scientific activities. We have also been able to begin the redevelopment of our Wildlife Area, with the support of the Hagg Lane Green Conservation Society. They have given up some of their spare time to look at how we can develop this area into an amazing teaching resource.

We have many plans for the future. We have applied for a Primary Science Quality Mark as recognition of all our hard work in science and we are looking to purchase another science trolley with resources that can be used outdoors as well as looking at setting up an Outdoor Science Laboratory!

Academies/National Curriculum

Recent news reports regarding Government intentions to move all schools into Academies, along with issues over testing and the new National Curriculum has created debate and concerns among both teachers and parents.
