This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

We follow the Kapow Scheme.

Outside of lesson time:

- Children can sing in our weekly singing assembly.
- They can join our choir after school if they wish.
- Children can become part of Rocksteady (at a cost) to play an instrument and be part of a band, and we offer 3 free places to Pupil Premium children.
- Children can take up 1:1 lessons with North Yorkshire County Council in guitar, bassoon, piano and violin.

- All children that play an instrument can perform in assembly or school performances.
- We provide space for practise in our library and thrive room.

Part C: Musical experiences

- At Christmas all children take part in a Christmas Concert for parents.
- Y6 perform at the end of summer showcasing singing and instrument playing.
- We prepare to sing at Harvest and Easter celebrations.
- We sing weekly in assembly
- Rocksteady children perform 3 times a year to the whole school.
- We pay for a musical pantomime to perform every January.
- Music teachers from North Yorkshire County Council come to assemblies to play live music.

In the future

In the past music teachers have come in to teach whole class trumpet, flute and violin. We are trying to find the funds to continue this in the future.
