You could describe what it looks like, how it moves or even what it eats. Don’t forget capital letters and full stops, as well as finger spaces. One of your sentences could start “Did you know that.....” This is a question so put a question mark (?) at the end, instead of a full stop. If you can’t find the clip, imagine a wonderful rain forest creature for yourself and explain to your reader what it looks like, how it moves and what it eats. Don’t forget to draw a picture of your animal too.</p>

Science	<p>Choose a day to keep a food diary. This means you need to write down everything you eat (and drink) for a day. You can draw pictures to help you – don’t forget to label them! To keep healthy, we should be eating at least 5 portions of fruit and vegetables a day – did you manage it?! Which are your favourite fruit and vegetables? Are they the same for everyone in your family? If you don’t know, do some research by asking your grown-ups including family and friends who you don’t live with? I wonder what the favourite fruit will be? And the favourite vegetable?</p>
PSHE	<p>At school we have some rules that we all come up with together to make being at school the best it can be for everyone. Do you have some rules to follow at home? They may not be written down but there are usually things that should be done (eg be kind or keep your room tidy) and things that should not be done (drawing on the walls or hurting people). How many can you think of? How do they help everyone? Make a poster with your house rules on- can you keep to the rules for a whole week?</p>

Art/Maths	<p>The rainforest is full of colourful animals, including more than 2000 species of butterflies. Butterflies have symmetrical markings on their wings. This means that one side is a reflection of the other side. If you have paint at home, you could make your butterfly by cutting out a butterfly shape, dripping your</p>

DT	<p>chosen paint onto one side and then folding the butterfly over (see for example <a href="https://artfulparent.com/butterfly-symmetry-paintings/">https://artfulparent.com/butterfly-symmetry-paintings/</a> and the related Youtube video <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=pF2nwgRWBkw">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=pF2nwgRWBkw</a> ). Or you could paint or use felt tips or crayons to carefully draw your symmetrical wings.
