

Class: Ash Year 3 – Topics for the week: VE Day and Animals including humans.

Subject	
Maths	<p>2D and 3D shapes – Find examples of different shapes around your house – square, rectangle, triangle, circle, pentagon, hexagon, heptagon, octagon. Cube, cuboid, sphere, cone, pyramid (square-based and tetrahedron – triangle-based)</p> <p>Can you sort them into 2D (have a width and height) or 3D (have a width, height and depth)?</p> <p>Can you name them all and state the properties:</p> <p>2D shapes: Number of sides, vertices (points), and any lines of symmetry</p> <p>3D shapes: Number of faces, vertices, edges.</p> <p>Do all shapes with the same name look the same? Eg triangles, pentagons, cuboids</p> <p>You might wish to make a picture from 2D shapes, or a model from 3D shapes. Have a go at the question sheets attached.</p>
English (reading/writing)	Reading and writing activities based on VE Day – see attached sheet
Science	<p>Watch the presentation about Nutrition, then complete the activity sheet (s)</p> <p>See if you can name the food types on your plate at each mealtime. Which are carbohydrates, proteins or fats? What fraction of the food is each type?</p>
History	VE Day – see attached
Geography	Which countries were involved in WW2? Speak to an older relative to help you with this. Can you find them on a map, and state which continent they are in?
PE	Create your own circuit training session. Make activity cards and
Art	VE day art - decorate your house with red white and blue, make bunting (Mrs Chappell's challenge), make your own medal for lockdown survival!
RE	Think of as many things as you can that you are thankful for right now. You can choose to make up a prayer, or write a letter of thanks.
Other	Can you camouflage yourself like a soldier? Make up a survival kit, create a den in the garden (weather permitting) and see how long you can survive without needing help from an adult. Let them help you to decide when the best time for this would be, you might be able to combine it with as particularly busy work day for them!
