Class Structure from September 2022

As some of you will be aware, over the past few years, due to budget constraints, myself and the Governors have had to consider reducing the number of classes from 6 to 5. This would involve mixing year groups across school and potentially splitting a number of classes.

After much discussion and deliberation, we have decided that it is important for us to maintain our current structure of 6 classes. We have also taken into account class sizes, the ongoing impact of the COVID pandemic, ensuring complete coverage of a broad and balanced curriculum and pupil and staff wellbeing.

Therefore, next year's structure will be:

EYFS – Apple Tree Class

Year 1 – Oak Class

Year 2 – Willow Class

Year 3 – Beech Class

Year 4 – Cedar Class

Year 5/6 – Sycamore Class

I have not yet allocated staff to classes. As you know we are currently recruiting two new members of staff. I will let you know as soon as possible.

We will, as in previous years (pre-Covid!) be having an in-school transition morning for children to spend time in their new classroom.
