!!! The FAN Club has Folded !!!

On Thursday morning, the FAN Club held an Extraordinary Meeting to identify a new Chair for the charity. However as no one has volunteered, the FAN Club can unfortunately no longer function. Certain vital roles need to be fulfilled for the charity to run including a Treasurer, Secretary and a Chair. Without a person as named Chair, we can legally no longer run as a Charity group.

The FAN Club raises much needed additional funds to supplement the existing school funds. Without the FAN Club operating, items like school trips and the yearly pantomime which the children massively enjoy will possibly be discontinued. The FAN Club also support the school funds to help subsidise things like reading books, give each class a yearly 'class fund', and help support the swimming lessons and forest school. Without the FAN Club, these additional funds would need to be generated elsewhere, for example asking parents to contribute considerably more than they do now per child to pay for these educational activities.

In 2018/19, the FAN Club raised an amazing £3666.92 from organising and running events such as the Christmas and Summer Fayres, a fashion show and gift shops for the children to buy a present for a member of their family. This money has been given back to the school to enrich the children's school experiences. To date in 2019/20, the FAN Club has raised £2445.21 from enjoyable events such as the Bingo night and the Christmas Fayre. Without a FAN Club continuing, the planned events such as the Scarecrow Hunt and the Summer Fayre may not an ahead and additional funds for the school would not be raised.

The running of the FAN Club is very much a team effort. Whilst the Chair is a vital role, the FAN Club is maintained by an established volunteer team. Having such a supportive team who attend meetings and help out when they can means that the Chair position is mainly to be the coordinator between the other committee members, lead meetings and be a liaison between the FAN Club and the School. The Chair position can be shared by two people who could then be Co-Chairs and split the role between them.

For the Charity to continue any further, a Chair needs to be identified before Friday 20th March, or sadly the FAN Club will be dissolved.
