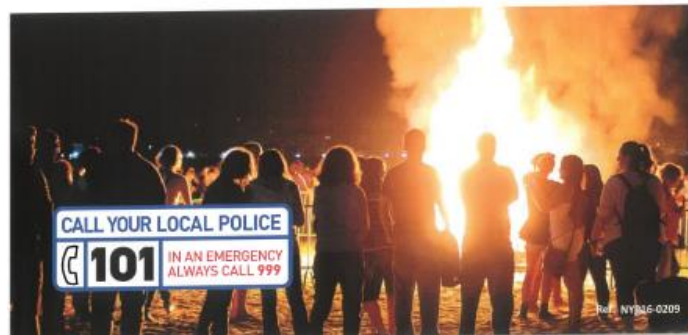


Make sure everyone enjoys this Bonfire Night
