Here are some parts of animals' bodies: claw, hoof, paw, flipper, antlers, horn, tusks, skin, fur, feathers, scales, wings, beak, gills, fin, tentacle. Can you name some animals which have these animal parts?

Do you remember that a polar bear has fur that keeps it warm and camouflages it in the cold and snowy Arctic, and that its claws help it to catch fish and other animals to eat?

Now think about how the different body parts of animals help them to survive in their habitats. You can find and cut out or draw pictures of some different animals, label their body parts and add in detail about how their body parts help them. Remember to think about how the animal moves, how it protects itself and what it eats. I wonder how many different sorts of animals you can do this for?
