English	<b>Story Writing</b> Work through the Identifying story opening sheet  Then have a go at write an example of each of the four types of story openings.
Maths	<b>Fractions Activity Pack</b>  Carry on with last week's Activity pack – This should keep you busy for this week and next  <b>TT Rockstars</b> – We are doing really well with times tables so keep up the good work and have a go at challenging each other to a tournament.
History	<b>Victorian Poster/ Collage</b> Create a poster or large collage picture summing up all the things you know about the Victorian Era. Don't forget to cover;- Royalty, Everyday life for Rich and Poor including housing, employment, food and schools. You could also tell me about the Empire, the Industrial Revolution and some amazing Victorian inventions.
Music /PE	<b>Are you the next Joe Wicks?</b>  Design your won workout routine. Remember to include a warm up and a cool down activity and fast and slow tasks

	that raise your heart beat . Try it out on other family members.
PSHE	<b>Healthy lifestyles</b>  Plan and prepare a simple healthy meal. Think about what a child's body needs to stay healthy your nutrient requirements. Have you included a good balance? Did everyone enjoy it? How did it make you feel while they were eating it?
Art/DT	<b>Scenes from a window</b>  Following on from last week's challenge from Mrs Chappell Have a look at some "famous paintings through a window" (Use google to get examples) Now have a go at creating your own work looking through a window - - don't forget to draw the window as part of your work!
Science	<b>Life Cycles in living things</b>  Complete the Life cycle activity sheet and then play the game with your family – Who can build their life cycle first and win!
